Georgetown: A community rich in sport and culture, Georgetown is known as one of the first communities to organize children's hockey leagues and home to annual events like the Highland Games and Head for the Hills Craft Beer Festival. Visit Downtown Georgetown for unique shops and restaurants, and tour an art exhibit at the Cultural Centre.

Acton: Better known as "Leathertown" Acton was home to a tannery and grist mill dating back to the 1840's. Tanning is a historically important industry in Acton, and at one time the largest tanner in Canada was located in Acton. To celebrate, thousands come out to the Leathertown Festival each year.


Glen Williams: This historic hamlet, located along the banks of the Credit River, was founded in 1825. Along with its picturesque rural setting, the distinctive character of Glen Williams is defined by beautiful heritage buildings that have been turned into artist studios, local restaurants and cafes.

Norval: Norval was once home to the famous Canadian author, Lucy Maud Montgomery. Montgomery wrote six books and journals in Norval in the 1920s and praised the village for its extraordinary natural beauty. The L.M.M Garden is open to the public and blooms with colour from spring to late fall. Adjacent to the garden is the Willow Park Ecology Centre and the Credit River.

Hornby: Hornby is located just off highway 401 and is home to an international shopping attraction, the Toronto Premium Outlets, and the 18-hole Hornby Glen Golf Course.
